

Adena Heath and the American Cancer Society recommend the following screening timeline for colon cancer.

Age 45 to 75 Adults at average risk for colorectal cancer should get screened.

Every 10 years starting at age 45 For adults with an average risk for colorectal cancer, every 10 years for a screening is recommended compared to the alternate stool FIT test which should be done annually.

If you are due for a colorectal cancer screening, talk to you primary care provider.
